THANKSGIVING AFTER ADOPTION

Thanksgiving after the Birth of a Child is giving thanks for the safety of the mother in giving birth to the child and for the life of the new-born baby. It is most appropriate to have the service in the hospital or at home soon after the birth. It is not in any way a substitute for the sacrament of baptism.

Thanksgiving after Adoption may be used in the home. If the child was baptized before adoption the service provides an opportunity for receiving him or her into the life of the parish and may be used at Holy Communion or at Morning or Evening Prayer. This service should not be used before the official Adoption Order has been made.

We thank you for the life of this child,
for his/her adoption into our family,
and for the privilege of parenthood,
accept our thanks and praise
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Minister

Father in heaven,
bless these parents
that they may cherish their child,
make them wise and understanding to help *him* as *he* grows,
and surround this family with the light of your truth
and the warmth of your love;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
