Welcome to the 2018 edition of the Ordination Newsletter which lists those currently studying at the Church of Ireland Theological Institute and provides information for those considering God's call to ordination.

We extend our good wishes to those who have recently commenced their studies, including 26 candidates, from across eight dioceses, training for the Ordained Local Ministry and congratulate those recently ordained to the Diaconate and the Priesthood.

We welcome the Reverend Robert Boyd as the new Diocesan Director of Ordinands in Derry & Raphoe, in succession to the Rev Canon Sam McVeigh, and wish him well in this new responsibility. As I write, the Commission on Ministry is putting together plans for a 'Vocations' Sunday' to take place in September next year.

It is hoped that, in due course, each Parish will receive a pack of resources to include information on the current pathways to ordination, suggested prayers and hymns for use on the Sunday in question together with visual aids, in print and online.

It is always a basic task of the Church to offer prayers for vocations to the ordained ministry, and for those in training, but it is hoped this combined effort will breath new life into our petitions.

A two-day Retreat, for those exploring ministry, is also being planned and is scheduled to take place in the spring of 2020.

It is with regret that we record the death in July of the Reverend Berni McAvoy, ordained Deacon at a special service in Saul Church last October. It was a great sadness to Berni that, due to ill health, she was not ordained to the Priesthood but we give thanks for her lively and inquiring mind, and great sense of humour, and rejoice in the absolute assurance that while she is 'absent from the body' she is 'present with the Lord'

n total twelve men and women have commenced training under a number of different pathways: Ten are residential ordinands (the three year full-time version of the MTh), one has opted for part-time training (the four year MTh), and there is one deacon who will be following a tailored programme over the next two years towards priesting within the Latvian Evangelical Lutheran Church Abroad (this has been implemented under the Porvoo Agreement). They are a happy, enthusiastic and genuinely diverse group. We salute their willingness to hear and heed the call of God, and we wish them every blessing for this crucial period of their ministerial formation.

In addition there has been a very

encouraging intake to the new certificate programme for Ordained Local Ministry, with an intake here



of 26 students from eight dioceses. Under the Covenant these courses are being offered in partnership with Edgehill Theological College and via its constituency membership of the Institute of Theology in Queen's University, Belfast. The programme has been designed to run as a blend

of central and regional inputs, and for this first year there will be tutorial hubs in Belfast, Cashel, Claremorris and Longford.
