INTRODUCTION

Jeremy Taylor, the distinguished Anglican theologian, who wrote devotional and theological books in the difficult days of the Commonwealth in England, came to Ireland in 1658 and is gratefully remembered in Lisburn and Ballinderry. In 1660 he became Bishop of Down and Connor. Although the times were controversial, he maintained, as was said at the time, much 'largeness and freedom of spirit'. His books, *Holy Living* and *Holy Dying* are still read. A study of his teaching on the Holy Communion by H.R. McAadoo (Archbishop of Dublin 1977-85) has drawn attention to the importance of Taylor's teaching in the book, *The Real Presence* (1654).

THE GOSPEL READING

Matthew 5: 17-20

For truly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. ADDITIONAL READING

From Holy Living by Jeremy Taylor (adapted)

There is no greater argument in the world of our spiritual danger and unwillingness to religion, than the backwardness which most people have always, and all people have sometimes, to say their prayers; so weary of their length, so glad when they are done, so witty to excuse and frustrate an opportunity: and yet all is nothing but a desiring of God to give us the greatest and the best things we can need, and which can make us happy; it is a work so easy, so honourable, and to so great a purpose, that in all instances of religion and providence (except only the Incarnation of His Son) God hath not given us a greater argument of His willingness to have us saved, and of our unwillingness to accept it, His goodness and our gracelessness, His infinite condescension and our carelessness and folly, than by rewarding so easy a duty with so great blessings.

your servant Jeremy Taylor became a learned teacher
through the gifts of the Holy Spirit of Christ,
that others might welcome his teaching as your gift,

that leads to eternal life.

As now we celebrate his memory
we join with angels and archangels
and all who have served you on earth
and worship you now in heaven
to raise our voices and proclaim your glory
for every praising you and saying:

Hosanna in the highest**

Merciful Father, we thank you
for these gifts of your creation, this bread and this wine,

who on the night he was betrayed took bread
and when he had given you thanks

Drink from this, all of you.
This is my blood of the new covenant
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.

Father, with this bread and this cup,
we do as our Saviour has commanded:
we celebrate the redemption he has won for us;
we proclaim his perfect sacrifice,
made once for all upon the cross,
his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension;
and we look for his coming
to fulfil all things according to your will.

Christ has died;

Christ is risen;

Christ will come again.

Renew us by your Holy Spirit,
unite us in the body of your Son,
and bring us with all your people
into the joy of your eternal kingdom;
through Jesus Christ our Lord,
with whom and in whom,
by the power of the Holy Spirit,
we worship you, Father almighty,
in songs of never-ending praise:
**Blessing and honour and glory and power
are yours for ever and ever. Amen.**
