When the Bishop of Tuam decided the time had come for him to stand down as president I was delighted to accept this exciting opportunity to be part of the youth ministry at this exciting time.

However let me first pay tribute to Bishop Richard for his stamina, patience and wise counsel. The youth department and in particular the central board, the executive and the staff are grateful for his constant support and friendship. During the past year there has also been a deepening of partnerships with the Youth Affairs Section of the Irish Government and the Priorities Fund. The Youth Department is very grateful to the R.C.B. for their support and constant help.

This workload will now be shaped y the impact of the Youth Work Audit that will be launched soon. In looking to the future CIYD will be beginning the process of making a new strategic plan for 2010-2015 which will be shaped by the youth work audit and of course the new economic situation.

The economic downturn will have a profound impact on youth work in the public and church sectors. Please pray for wisdom for those who will have to make hard choices in the support given to youth work.

Finally I want to say thank you to the staff who serve us and our young people with such energy and professionalism. They are a great gift to us and please do not take them for granted.
