We would love to be the recipient and the communicator of a million good news stories. That is how we would like to be spending our time and energy through our communications strategy – and we hope that in our new website we have achieved a new 'fit for purpose' vehicle to achieve this. There has been a lot of work to achieve the quality of this new website and we are deeply grateful to all concerned, especially the Church House communications staff.
